

Riots Are Promised If Canada Resorts to Conscription For Army

By Associated Press Montreal, May 25.—Many street demonstrations, which culminated in a large open-air mass meeting as a protest against conscription, occurred here last night. Mayor Martin appeared before the crowd and pleaded with them not to commit acts of violence or attack property. Prior to the mass meeting the demonstration took the form of street parades in which many young men participated. When they came together they were addressed by fiery orators,

some of whom predicted that a state of affairs little short of revolution would result in Canada if the proposed conscription was adopted. Others, however, counseled the crowd to be patient and wait for Sir Wilfrid Laurier, who, they said, was against the bill and was still there (in the Canadian Parliament) to defend you. The mass meeting was organized by two Liberal clubs.

Try to Alter Birth Dates to Escape Conscription

Philadelphia, May 25.—After Judge Thompson, in Federal Court, had refused yesterday to allow Harry Cooper, a Russian, to escape conscription by changing the date of birth

in his naturalization papers, Chief Naturalization Examiner Shoemaker disclosed that his office has been flooded by requests of soon-to-be citizens to rectify "errors" they had made in giving the time of their birth. Most of them explained they discovered the "error" months ago, but by a singular coincidence all the requests to change the date have come since Congress passed the conscription law. It is noticeable, too, that every single man has asked to have his birthday switched so that he could appear on the records as 21 or older. "Just plain slackers," said Examiner Shoemaker. "We have been refusing their requests because we felt there was absolutely no merit in them. We told them they could carry the matter to the court if our decision didn't satisfy them."

Brazil Is Seized All Ships Interbed by Germany

By Associated Press Rio Janeiro, May 25.—It is stated in official circles that parliament will order the confiscation of all German ships in Brazilian ports as soon as the official report of the inquiry into the torpedoing of the Brazilian steamer Tijuca, made at Bordeaux, is received. At the same time parliament will decree the revocation of Brazil's declaration of neutrality.

FRENCH SEA LOSS SMALL Paris, May 25.—One French merchantman of more than 1,600

tons and two under that tonnage were sunk by mines or submarines during the week ending May 20. Three ships were unsuccessfully attacked, while 91 entered French ports and 1,016 sailed in the same period.

MUST WIN MEDALS London, May 26.—An officials ban has been placed on the wearing of miniature war medals and decorations, unless in the case of such persons to whom they have been actually awarded. A firm which recently manufactured miniatures of war honors such as brooches, bracelets and lockets, has been informed that they will not be allowed to sell them. The idea is to prevent the cheapening of war honors.

Mrs. George W. Guthrie Is Home From Japan

San Francisco, May 25.—Mrs. George W. Guthrie, widow of the late United States Ambassador to Japan, arrived at a Pacific coast port today, preceding the body of her husband, which is due later. The body will be sent east after respects are paid to the late ambassador by public officials and naval and army organizations.

REPAIR LIBERTY HALL Dublin, Ireland, May 25.—Liberty Hall, which was partially wrecked by bombardment during the Dublin

rebellion, is being repaired and fitted out for use as a communal kitchen.

AMERICAN GIVES \$50,000 Cambridge, England, May 25.—An anonymous American donor has given Cambridge University \$50,000 as an endowment fund for the inauguration of a school of Spanish language, literature and history.

STUDENTS ARE FARMERS Liverpool, May 25.—Students of Liverpool College are planting and caring for a potato farm covering fifteen acres, one of the largest potato farms in the vicinity of Liverpool.

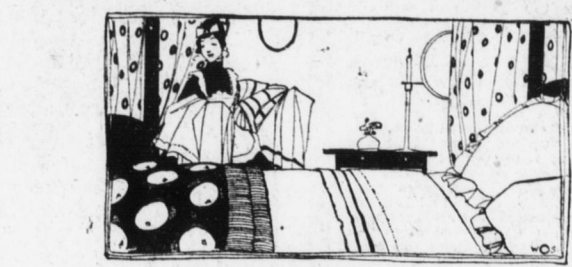

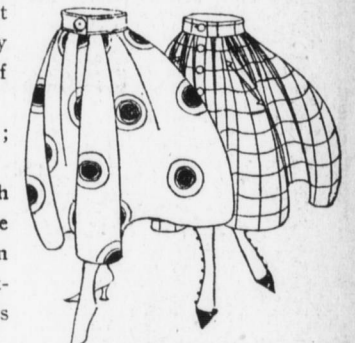
