By Associated Press Washington, May 26. — Food reg. ulations of the allies which probably will furnish the basis for somewhat similar rules in the United States Jennings Mfg. Co. are being assembled by the government. American regulations probably will be less stringent, but this is not deterring. Herbert C. Hoover, select-ed for food administrator, and other officials from giving careful study to the codes of other warring nations. Here are some of the more strik-ing British regulations: For public meals the allowance of meat is based on an average of five ounces for each luncheon and din-ner, and two ounces for each break-fast served on non meatless days.
