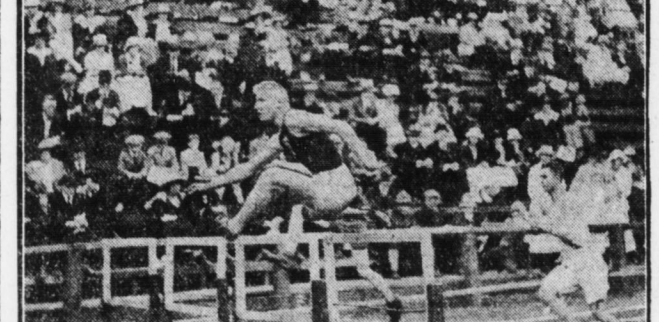

The nearest they came to not scoring was in the pole vault where but one point was secured. The summary of events show that records were broken in the broad jump, one mile relay, 220-yard hurdles, and equaled in the 120-yard hurdles. Tech athletes were the record breakers.
