The game commission is given full authority to remove any game birds or animals the prove destructive to property and property owner may pursue and kill a bear that attacks person or property and may kill a deer of any sex that is actually engaged at the time in destruction of crops or trees on his property.

The penalties are the same as before provided except that the penalty for the illegal killing of an elk is made \$200 and six months imprisonment, and the use of a gun propelling more than one bullet or ball at a time is forbidden in the hunting of deer or elk.
