Paris, June 9.—After a two-days session, during which Admiral Lacaze, minister of finance, and the conduct of the navy were under fire, especially on account of merchant marine losses, the chamber of deputies voted last night confidence in the government by 310 to 178. The bulk of the attack in the closing session centered on the alleged laxity of measures taken to combat submarines, including reproaches that the budget did not provide sufficiently for antisubmarine mesaures.

Premier Ribot, in defense of the government, declared that the submarine war had surprised the navies of all the allies. He did not deny the peril and asked for increased credits to meet this new form of warfare.
