THIRD-CLASS CITY BILL IS PASSED

Police Civil Service Goes to Governor; House Holds Prolonged Sessions

Senator Craig's bill providing civil service for police forces of third-class cities was passed in the House by 122 to 32, after a debate between members from three-class cities late yesterday afternoon.

Mr. Ramsey, Delaware, said the third-class cities wanted to be let alone and that many members did not believe in the practical side of civil service. Mr. Aron, Philadelphia, moved to drop the bill from the calendar, but did not press the motion.

The bill to enable second class townships to share in the distribution of tax on premiums from foreign fire insurance companies was passed with little comment. The Senate bill also passed at the afternoon session. The bill changes the periods of storage and was attacked by Mr. Glass, Philadelphia, who said that this was not a good idea.

The House passed the bill amending the women's employment law so that the State Industrial Board may have authority to extend hours for waitresses in hotels to fifty-four hours a week. The Standtander bill giving right to recommend candidates for registrars in all second-class cities to political committees was also passed.

The Stern bill forbidding dissemination of information relative to birth control was passed in the House, 133 to 3, at the night session. It had been termed the chief literary feat of the session by Mr. Maurer, Berks, the Socialist member. Mr. Maurer said that the bill would be a great relief to the people who are not now paying any attention to the subject.
