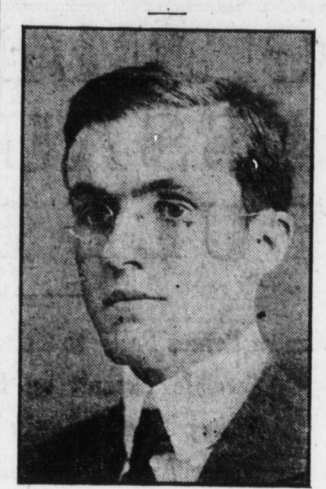

Mr. Heck, secretary to the American ambassador, Abram L. Elkus, of New York, is still in his twenties and holds the highest rank for his age of any official of the United States in the foreign service.

Mr. Heck's father received a letter from him, dated May 29 in Constantinople, saying that he would remain there with his wife and small daughter, occupying the Swedish legation while in charge of American interests in Turkey.

LOCHIEL SCHOOL CLOSES SEASON

Physically Defective Children Have Record Year Studying in the Open

The Lochiel Open-air School continues to be a great institution for the promotion of health and education for the physically defective children of the city.

Out of the forty-four children enrolled two alone failed to gain in weight. This year Samuel Herzog gained thirteen and three-quarters pounds. After a thorough examination by our medical inspector Samuel Herzog was pronounced sound in body and mind and will be returned to a regular grade school.

At the beginning and close of each year the doctor gives a haemoglobin or blood test. The boys average 13.5 and the girls 12.5. The total number of pounds gained this year was 194, making an average gain of four and three-fourths pounds.

From an average enrollment of thirty-two pupils, the school had an average attendance of thirty-two. When one considers that most of these pupils attended regular schools on an average of from one-third to one-half of the time you will see that fresh air does count.

Coldest Weather No Bar Nor was there any decrease in attendance during the winter months. On one of the coldest days, when the pipes burst and the children had to stay at home, the boys were very loath to go. It is fun for them to battle with the cold and they wanted to know how much they could endure.

The pupils and teachers of the Lochiel Open-air School wish to thank all persons who contributed to the pleasure of the school, especially the Civic Club, the Sunshine Society, the Associated Aid Societies and the Technical High school.
