

Kaiser's Power is Unshaken by Political Move

Washington, July 11.—Germany's latest political difficulties are regarded by officials here as due largely to internal problems and probability of a transitory nature only.

The dismissal of Foreign Secretary Zimmermann, Minister Finance Heilficher or even Chancellor Von Bethmann-Hollweg would be considered a large step.

The German foreign office, it was pointed out to-day, has served during the war merely as a means to get military matters out of the hands of the Kaiser.

Officials are puppets. American officials agree with allied diplomats and that the German officials who figure so largely in the news are in fact largely puppets being pulled across the stage.

Only Matter of Time. Fundamental internal reform in Germany is felt here to be only a matter of time.

Austria's influence is becoming more and more over and against a liberal peace. Austria is said to be treated most contemptuously by German officials and given consideration only as an unavoidable weak link in the chain.

Magazine Publisher is Accused of Unfair Tactics by Federal Trade Board

Washington, July 11.—Formal complaint against the Curtis Publishing Company was issued to-day by the Federal Trade Commission.

Allegations on which the trade commission's complaint was brought were made by the Pictorial Review Company, which charges that the Curtis Company used the Saturday Evening Post, Ladies Home Journal and the Country Gentleman to hamper the sale of the Pictorial Review Magazine.
