Austrian Lower House Adjourns Indefinitely

Vienna, July 17.—The lower house has adjourned indefinitely. The president, in concluding his speech, said: "We remain here in the way of constitutional life. We have strengthened the assured position of the house. May it have strength to fulfill the great task of rebuilding the empire."

Premier of Dual Empire Declares Monarchy Will Stick to Its Allies

Vienna, July 17.—Austria-Hungary ideas on peace were made known to the constitutional committee of the Reichsrath in an address by the premier, Dr. von Seydler. After referring to the unbreakable unity between Austria and her allies, Dr. von Seydler declared parliament would work for "the aim for which Austria is fighting, namely, the unassailable, sacred right of her peoples to decide for themselves their internal destiny."
