"The heated spell is at an end in all parts of the country," the Weather Bureau announced to-day, "although conditions in the far Northwest indicate the return of warmer weather in northern districts within a few days. Light local rains fell Thursday in the Middle Atlantic States and substantial showers were experienced in North Carolina and in portions of the East Gulf States. Light rains also fell in Oklahoma and Kansas. It will be slightly cooler to-night in New England and the Middle Atlantic States and a little warmer on Saturday.
