
Russian Brotherhood May Send Men to Galicia

Exceptions are the parliamentarians Von Krause, national vice-president of the Prussian diet, who, however, belongs to the conservative wing of that party, and Dr. Peter Spahn, the aged Catholic leader whose health is so poor that it is doubtful whether he will be able to stand the strain of ministerial labors. He collapsed and fainted in a Reichstag committee meeting recently. He has not yet fully recovered.

Herr Von Krause's appointment is a compliment to the Prussian bar, of which he is a prominent member. Herr Von Waldow, head of the imperial food ministry, is an agrarian conservative representing the interests which hampered the work of his predecessor, Herr Von Batocki, in every possible way. Herr Von Graevinitz, who, as undersecretary of the imperial chancellory occupies a position akin to the president's secretary in America, also is prominent as a conservative. conservative.


