WILL PAY FOR LIBERTY LOAN **ADVERTISING**

From One to Two Millions Will Be Spent by U. S. in Next Campaign

By Associated Press Washington, Aug. 16 .- A detailed plan for advertising the next issue of Liberty Loan bonds in newspapers and

other mediums of publicty, to cost from \$1,000,000 to \$2,000,000 and to be paid for by the Government, was presented to-day to Secretary McAdoo by the National Advertising Advisory Board, with the recommendation that it be adopted.

On the basis of an expenditure of \$1,000,000, the following distribution of the fund was suggested:

Daily, monthly and weekly papers, including those printed in forcing language, \$700,000; farm papers, \$100,000; small town dailies and weeklies, \$100,000; printing posters, circulars, etc., \$100,000.

The mediums which the board proposes to use are detailed as follows: Newspapers, magazines, farm papers, business press, religious press for Newspapers, magazines, farm papers, business press, religious press, for-egn language press, painted bulletins, billboards, street cars, circularizations, house organs and factory bulletins.
