### Seven Billion Bond Issue in House Committee

By Associated Press Washington, Aug. 18. — The House ways and means committee had before it to-day Secretary McAdoo's proposal for a bond issue of \$7,538,945,000 to bear 4 per cent interest and subject only to income supertaxes, war profits and excess profits taxes.
