FEW OPPOSING WAR INSURANCE Administration Forces Seek Early Passage of Bill to **Protect Soldiers**

Washington, Aug. 20. - Adminitration forces will make every effort to secure an early passage in Congress of the bill providing for war risk insurance. With more and more members lining up to the support of the measure, it is thought it can be rushed through with only slight opposition

The chief objection raised by insurance men who are interested in seeing the bill defeated is that it is undemocratic in that it permits sol diers of independent means to pur chase insurance not accessible to others. Secretary of the Treasury McAdoo has answered this by stat-ing that the highest premium will amount to about \$\$ a thousand. He has also urged that the United States, in passing the draft law, took the obligation to see that families of men in service be provided for. This, he says, is a duty which the Gov-ernment would be very lax and un-fair in failing to observe. Mr. McAdoo attributes many of the demanded exemptions to the fact that no arrangement has as yet been made properly to care for the de-pendents of the soldiers. He points out that no man can be expected to proffer his services if he does not know that during his absence, and in event of his death or disa-bility, his loved ones will be pro-tected from want. It is further surged that any ob-jection to the act on the grounds that it is not based on sound busi-ness principles is absurd, inasmuch as the insurance end will be handled after the plan of the large insur-ance companies, except that no load-ing of premiums for office expenses will be charged, and the mortality tables, without reference to the added danger during war times, will be used. This, of course, means that the business will prove expensive to the Government.
