operation between Japan and Amer will be discussed.

A dinner at the White House by the President, with Viscount Ishil as the guest of honor, will round out the day's activities. Among the more important war measures which the mission is ex-pected to discuss with officials are the disposition of Japanese shipping with a view to making it one of the great-est aids in the conduct of the war; ocean freight rates and the enlarge-ment of Japan's naval activities.






