

MARKET ADVANCES IN EARLY HOURS

Initial Prices Generally Higher With Indications of Better Conditions; Weakness in Motors and Rails Causes Reaction

New York, Sept. 11.—There was a more general disposition to purchase stocks at an advance at the opening today. Initial prices were higher in most instances. Gains were extended when it became evident that the shorts were bidding for stocks. Indications of better conditions in the copper industry were reflected in a higher range of prices for copper stocks. Subsequent marked weakness in Pullman, General Motors and New Haven caused a reaction. New Haven dropped 2 points to 2 1/2 a new low record.

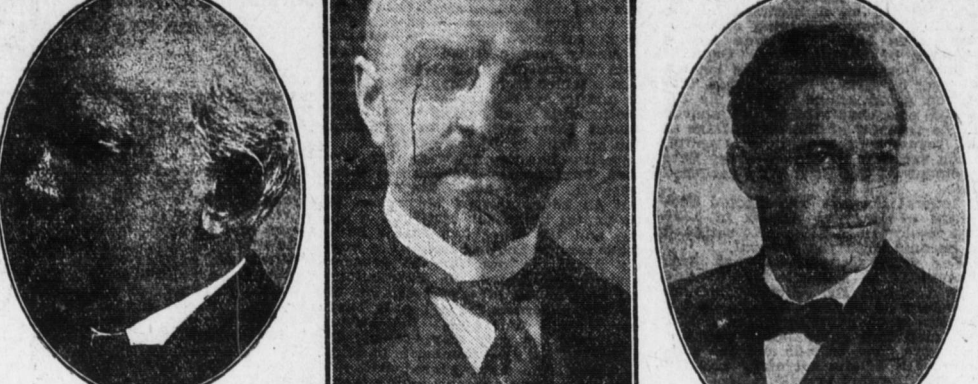

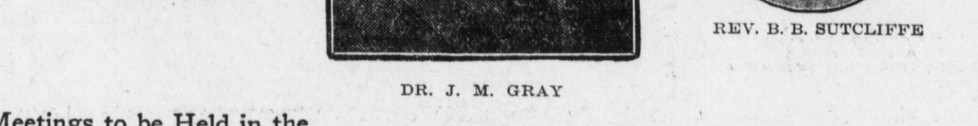

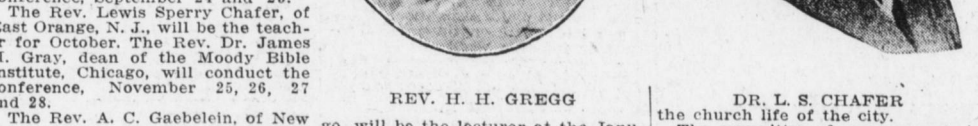

GREAT WAR TAX BILL GOES BACK FOR CONFERENCE

Senator Penrose Explains Republican Attitude on Measure

Washington, Sept. 11.—The big war tax bill was today back in the hands of the House following its passage by the Senate last night. The measure passed the House May 23, and now goes to conference. The Senate added more than \$500,000,000 to the bill.

It is hoped that the differences between the two houses may be settled within two weeks, after which the bill will be laid before President Wilson for his signature.

The Senate approved the bill 69 to 4, the negative votes being cast by Senators Borah, Gronna, La Follette and Norris. The action came after the high tax group had again sought to secure the adoption of Senator La Follette's substitute. It was voted down 65 to 15.

The war revenue bill, providing for a levy somewhat under \$2,400,000,000, the largest tax measure in the history of the world was passed by the Senate last night.

That the Republicans in the Senate have made no effort to protect against the bill, the consideration is indicated by the fact that with the exception of the four named every Republican Senator joined with the majority in the passage of the bill.

Then the Senate voted 52 to 28 to strike out all consumption taxes in the bill, including those on sugar and tea and cocoa, all designed to raise \$86,000,000.

By a vote of 51 to 27 the clause leaving intact a provision in the bill and its substitutes and designed to raise \$18,500,000, was stricken out.

The Senate adopted 40 to 34 Senator Smoot's motion to strike out a zone increase in second class postage rate beyond 300 miles and designed to secure \$12,500,000. The House committee's special publishers' profits provisions already had been eliminated.

Senator Owen's amendment providing for a tax ranging from one per cent to inheritances of \$100,000 to 100 per cent on those over \$50,000 was rejected by a vote of 51 to 30.

The Jones amendment, revised by the committee to levy a ten per cent tax upon corporations and unincorporated surplus was adopted on a viva voce vote. A substitute by Senator Joyce to eliminate an exemption in the committee's draft of the bill was rejected by a vote of 51 to 35.

La Follette's substitute war tax bill, proposing a 10 per cent tax on the advance interest and income, war profits, liquor and tobacco was rejected, 65 to 15.

Republican Attitude
Senator John Penrose in a statement to-night made it clear that he and other Republican Senators while considering the taxes too high and put aside the power to give and reported the bill entirely as a war measure. Senator Penrose said:

"The revenue bill is the result of the committee's exhaustive and protracted consideration by the Finance Committee and more than one month on the floor of the Senate. During this period the bill has been in Washington and conferred freely with members of the committee and other Senators. Much valuable information has been received in this way particularly by the committee. An effort has been made to eliminate many objectionable features and make the bill as satisfactory as possible to the majority, at the same time providing an adequate amount of revenue. Much work remains to be done by the conference committee."
