

KEEP HOMES COOL AND SAVE COAL, NEW HOOVER PLAN

Asks Housekeepers to Reduce Temperatures at Least Five Per Cent.

Washington, Sept. 13.—Through the Chamber of Commerce of the United States, Dr. H. A. Garfield, fuel administrator, has appealed to American housewives to assist in the conservation of coal.

"If every family will reduce the temperature of its house at least five degrees, it will mean that millions of tons of coal will be saved and the health of the nation will be improved.

Much Fuel Wasted. The coal supply can be conserved by more economical methods of firing, by sitting ashes, by watching the furnace door and by heating only the rooms in use.
