MAY BUILD NEW LEMOYNE BRIDGE

It is Understood That a Structure Will Be Erected Over Reading Railroad

Lemoine, Sept. 26. — When the committee from the West Shore Firemen's Union asked State Highway officials what they could do in regards to bettering conditions at the Lemoine Cumberland Valley and Reading Railroad bridges members were informed that state officials have been working in conjunction with the Valley Railways Company to better conditions at the Reading Railroad bridge for sometime.

It is understood that a new bridge will be erected across the Reading Railroad. Just when an official announcement in regard to the erection of a new bridge and the plan of the new structure will be made, is not known.

Cumberland Valley Refuses

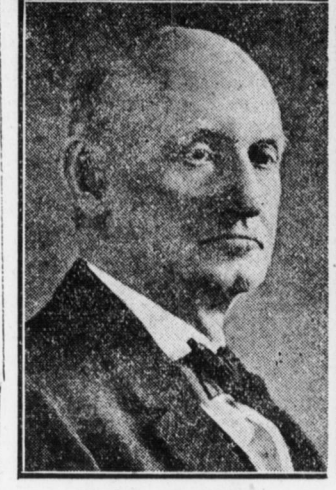
