COAL SHORTAGE **DEPENDS SOLELY UPON DEMAND**

LUMBER AND MILL WORK Garfield Not Sure That Nation Will Have Sufficient Supply

By Associated Press Washington, Oct. 10.-Whether

there will be a coal shortage in the United States this winter depends, Dr. H. A. Garfield, the fuel admin-istrator, declared to-day entirely on istrator, declared to-day entirely on the extent of the demand, which has

istrator, declared to-day entirely on the extent of the demand, which has not been disclosed.

"If our industrial development from the war and other causes," said Dr. Garfield, "has grown beyond our ten per cent increase in production over last year then we must go short. We have no figures at hand to tell what that development has been."

Dr. Garfield's statement was made in connection with an announcement of the lifting of the embargo on coal exports to Canada. Permission for shipments to go forward again was given when it was found that they would not endanger the supply of the northwestern states.

"This action was taken," it was anounced, "because it is vital that Canada's war industries be kept going at full blast in order that she may remain an effective ally of America in the war. The American northwest will be properly supplied. "Canada got approximately 19, -00,000 tons of coal anthractic and bituminous from this country last year. This year she will receive the same amount plus an increase prorated upon the excess over last year's production, substantially as though she were a state of the union. The fuel administration is working on the prorating plan."

Figures submitted to the fuel administration by the Geological Survey, it was said, show that the United States is now nearly a month ahead of last year's production at this time.
