



and wattles. In severe cases these may appear on all parts of the body. The disease in Pennsylvania usually is a late fall and early winter one. The bird will readily show the signs of the disease for three to five weeks. The comb usually shirly-els and the birds are off feed and off lay about two months. Laying pullets seem to be the most susceptible and as such birds are the fall and winter layers the loss in egg yield is severe.

A peculiar phase of this disease is that a bird once having had it, even in its mildest form, is ever afterward immune. The last Pennsylvania epidemic occurred three years ago and as presumably all birds of that period have gone the way of all chickens, there are no immunes left and an epidemic now introduced would be a severe one.
