

RETAILERS KEEP FOOD PRICES UP, CHARGES HOOVER

350,000 Dealers Blamed For Holding High Levels, Despite Regulations

Hoover Turns Light on These Food Facts

The average price of flour a barrel, \$13.77, is from \$1.50 to \$2 greater than it was at the wholesale price.

Washington, Oct. 19. — Herbert Hoover declares that the public is paying too much for many of the necessities of life, and he placed the responsibility squarely up to the retail food distributor.

Asked if he would go before Congress in December for power to regulate the conduct of the retailers in the meantime would decide what he would do in December.

Hoover Outlines Plans Lacking power to compel the retailers to do business on the basis of cost and a fair profit, Mr. Hoover declared that he intends to do the following things in an effort to wipe out excessive profits:

Inaugurate a system by which the wholesale prices of principal staples shall be published in every consumer center every day, so that the public may know what the retailers are paying for their stocks.
