"The Yale spirit is still here," said Professor Cowell, but it is a question of finding the proper number of men to make a team.

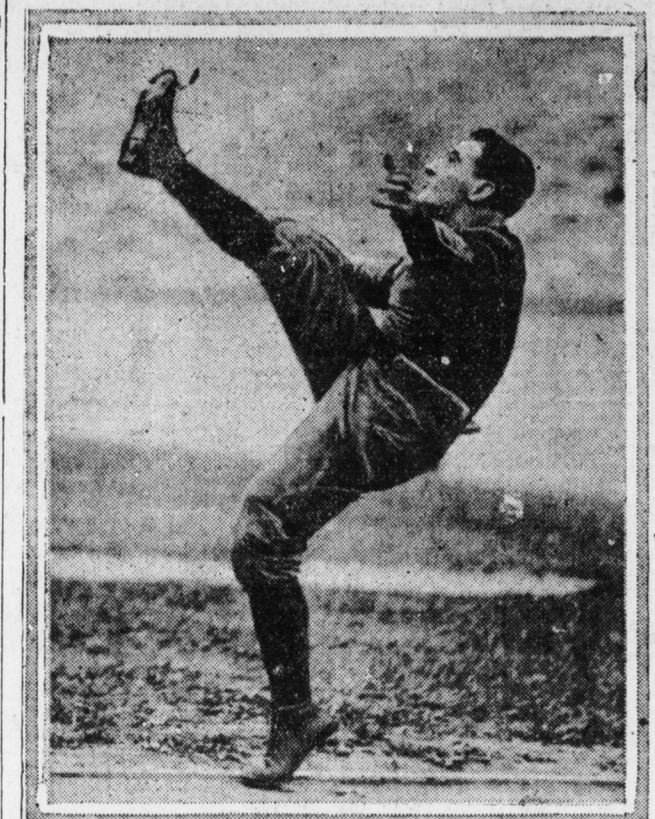
Camp Hill Candidates Working Hard to Win Positions on Team
