Italian Second Army Bucher, Lancaste Quit Without Fight

The withdrawal leaves the Germans without a foothold on the Esthonian coast, attempts by them to follow up the original landing by putting troops ashore at points both north and south of the peninsula having failed ac-cording to the Russian reports. There has been a somewhat prevalent as-sumption, however, that there was never any intention by the Germans to push their Riga operations much beyond the naval stage this fail, the view being that the threat against the gulf of Finland may well have been a diversion for political effect in Russia or to distract attention from operations in preparation else-where.


