Bryan Stirred to Anger on Question of Pacifism; Nation Behind Government
Philadelphia, Pa., Nov. 19.—Opera house yesterday to address the prohibition matter, meeting, William Jennings Bryan greeted an interview by newspapermen in the lobby of the Bellevue-Stratford. He said he was in a hurry and he evidently was, but he cut the interview short when he was asked if he thought the activities of pacifists before the war had anything to do with drawing the nation into the conflict.

"That is not a proper question for a loyal citizen to ask," he shot back. "And I am through with you."

"But Colonel Roosevelt says that is the fact. Would you call him a disloyal citizen?" he was asked.

"You will have to ask him," was his reply.

Mr. Bryan answered questions from others, however, predicting that nationwide prohibition was inevitable. He declared the liquor tax had proved effective in closing a great many saloons, but he said the great force against the saloon was public opinion and public sentiment.

"In my opinion," he said, "the government is doing everything it should do in regard to closing saloons because of the war. I have not discussed the question of dissatisfaction with the war, but I am certain the country is being benefited by the closing of saloons. It is my opinion that the reports from Allentown to the effect that the soldiers there refused to attend the lecture on the ground that he was a pacifist. He said these reports were not true."

"Will the conduct of the war be an issue in the next Presidential campaign?" he was asked.

"No one can say anything about that," was his reply.

Mr. Bryan also denied the story that he had been chased up a tree by a bull out in Arizona.
