When the West Side combination fire truck arrives, which from all accounts will be to-morrow, the motorization of Steelton's fire department will be complete.

Fire Chief O. E. B. Malehorn said this morning that what plans have been made for dedication of the apparatus will not be announced until the additional truck has arrived.

With the entire department motorized Steelton stands in the front line with boroughs much larger than this one. There are six companies. The apparatus has been assigned and delivered to the five companies as follows: Citizen and Baldwin, pumps; Paxtang, hook and ladder; East End and Hygienic, combination trucks.
