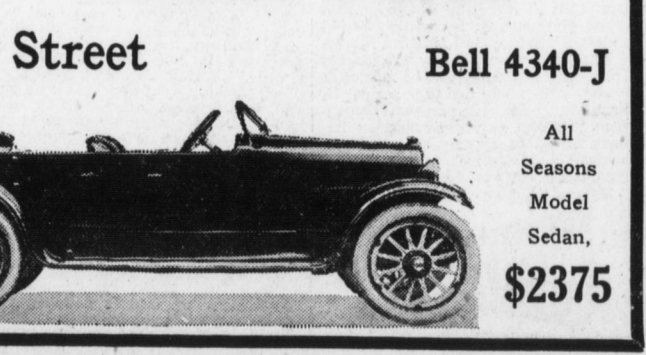

Enola, Pa., Dec. 1.—Officials of the State Health Department expressed their belief yesterday that the recent outbreak of typhoid fever in Enola had been checked. During the epidemic last month fourteen cases were reported to the Health Department.

During the investigation the health officials investigated several "dead ends" but found nothing in these pipes which would contaminate the water supply. However, citizens of the town blame the drinking water for the epidemic and several people are desirous of calling a public meeting to discuss the subject.
