Compensation Board Gives Decisions in Several Appeals Taken Recently

In deciding against allowing the appeal of the Philadelphia and appeal of the Philadelphia and Reading Railway Company from the award of compensation by the referee in the case of Frederick J. In the case of Philip Penti-bone, Reading, appealing from the disallowance of compensation claimed from the Philadelphia and Reading, the board decides that the accident occurred in interstate oper-ations and therefore is for federal adjustment.
