## SEC. OF MUNITIONS CABINET MEMBER PROPOSED BY BILL

Probable Action by Legislators Result of War Operations Investigation

IN CONTROL OF SUPPLIES

War Department to Operate During Term of War and For One Year Thereafter

By Associated Press Washington, Jan. 4.—A department of munitions under a new cabinet head known as the secretary of munitions, is proposed in a bill inroduced to-day by Chairman Chamberlain, of the Senate Military Com-

mittee, as a result of its investigation of war operations.

Then ew department would oper-Then ew department would operate during the war and one year thereafter. The bill has the backing of the Senate committee and will be strongly pressed. The new secretary of munitions would have power under the President's direction to control arms, ammunition, food. clothing, equipment, tentage, trasportation and any other materials the President shall designate as munitions of war.

the President shall designate as munitions of war.

Government bureaus, agencies and funds necessary to a munitions administration would be transferred to the new department which contemplates control of naval as well as army supplies.

"The bill is intended to increase and expedite the supply of munitions of war," said Senator Chamberlain.
"One great trouble with the war establishment as disclosed by the investigation has been a lack of coordination and the seeming impossibility of getting rid of circuitous methods of doing business. Until there can be co-ordination and methods more direct, the United States will be grouping in the dark for many months before we can place ourselves in proper fighting trim.

"This measure places all jurisdic-

place ourselves in proper lighting trim.

"This measure places all jurisdiction over munitions of war which is defined at length in the ball—and covering everything in one person known as the secretary of munitions: subject to the direction, of course, of the President. It co-ordinates all the bureaus, cuts red tape, does away with useless decisions what had tended only to hamper direct action and gets to theheart of the whole situation. gets to theheart of the whole situation.

"I believe if Congress can see its way to the enactment of this measure, and the proper man, is placed at the head of the Department of Munitions, Americal will soon be occupying its proper place at the battle front. It will be noted the measure is only in force during the continuance of the war which brings it into existence."
