Washington, Jan. 14.—On advice of the Department of Justice, the Bureau of Internal Revenue yesterday decided to leave to the Supreme Court determination of whether, in figuring income and excessive profits for the last year, inventories may be made on the basis of either original cost or present market value, which ever is lower.

50 More Belgians Are Executed by Germans

London, Jan. 14.—Word has been received here at the Belgian official quarters of fifty-eight more official executions in Belgium. This brings the number of Belgians executed in 1917, to 176, among whom were at least two women, three girls from 14 to 16 years old, and several youths under twenty.
