Pedestrians Are Puzzled by Progress of Penn-Harris

Do you agree with a Telegraph reporter that the construction on the Penn-Harris Hotel is now working on the tenth floor? Most persons believe that the work is now proceeding on the eighth floor, while others insist that it is the ninth

According to the construction superintendent the floor immediately above the high story is called the second floor and there are the grill, lobby and mezzanine floors below that story.

The concrete stairs are now erected from bottom to the top of the building. The method of the concrete construction during cold weather is to build the wood forms for a floor, supported by struts from the floor below, tile blocks six inches thick are placed on the wood forms. The steam concrete mixer is in the cellar, all sand and crushed stone are first heated by means of steam coils, then mixed with cement and hot water, hoisted by elevator, then poured while hot and covered with tar paper

poured while not and covered with far paper Fires are kept burning in sala-manders for several days in the screened-in story which prevents the concrete from freezing before it

Temporary heating mains are being installed and connection made with the service heating main in Walnut street—Temporary heat will soon be provided throughout the building.

Partitions on two floor, are being erected and the bath tubs are being set. The exterior brick walls are erected to the third floor level on the east and south sides.

Twelve cars of window frames, granite and architectural terra-cotta have arrived and the street fronts will be started early next week.
