Sunshine Society Gives Cash to Civilian Relief

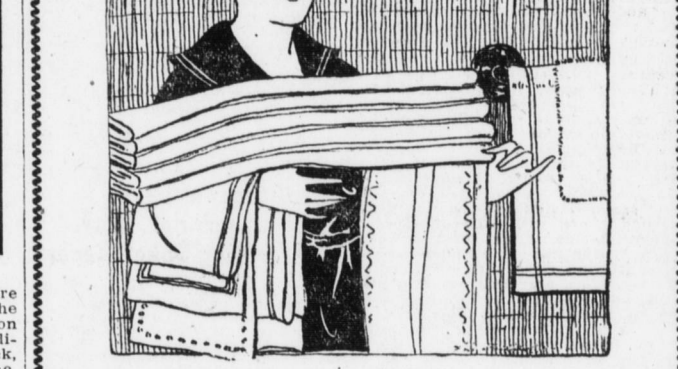
