The models for winter resort wear seem to be springing up by the right. They are youthful and simple in effect, though the new materials show mature thought in manufacture and design.

Stripes are to be in evidence everywhere, especially for separate skirts, with clever belt and suspender arrangements, as shown in the first model. Waists of voile, satin and silk crepe de chine are worn with the skirts. In medium size the design pictured requires 3 3/4 yards 40-inch material, with 2 1/2 yards 36-inch silk for the waist.

Five yards of 40-inch cotton voile will make the costume to the right, and 1 3/4 yards 36-inch novelty silk will be required for the trimming. The model is an excellent one for the woman who is making over frocks added to the wardrobe at last summer's sale.

The skirt shows the new drapery at the back which you may call a bustle, but it is really more graceful and attractive than the bustle ever was or could be.

As you see the dress here, it is made of a soft taffeta with trimming of fur and with a little embroidery of beads that is very pretty. Taffeta is exceedingly well liked for young girls' dancing dresses and suits this design peculiarly well. It would be quite correct to omit the embroidery on the skirt and use just a little on the blouse portion or perhaps just merely to outline the neck with some little sprays of flowers worked out in iridescent beads. You can use any braiding or embroidery pattern for beads if you transfer to tissue paper and work through that as well as the material, tearing the paper away when the work is done.
