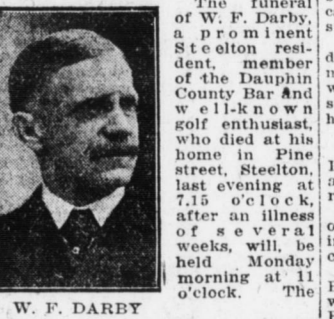

W. F. DARBY TO BE BURIED MONDAY. The funeral of W. F. Darby, a prominent Steeltown resident, member of the Dauphin County Bar and well known as a golf enthusiast, who died at his home in Pine street, Steelton, last evening at 7:15 o'clock, after an illness of several weeks, will be held Monday morning at 11 o'clock. The Rev. Dr. Ellis N. Kemer, pastor of Reformed Salem Church, Harrisburg, will officiate, assisted by the Rev. C. B. Seigel, pastor of the First Presbyterian Church, Steelton. Burial will be made in the Harrisburg cemetery.

W. F. DARBY TO BE BURIED MONDAY

Attorney and Golf Enthusiast Was Widely Known and Respected



W. F. Darby was for fifteen years a member of the Steelton School Board, twelve years of that time president. About two years ago he was forced to resign on account of ill health. For many years he was an attorney for the Pennsylvania Steel Company, Steelton National Bank and Steelton Trust Company. He was graduated with honors from Central High School in class 1878. In his early life he carried the Harrisburg Telegraph. He was registered as a law student with the late John W. Young and was admitted to the Dauphin County Bar and immediately opened a law office in Steelton. Later he was admitted to practice in Cumberland and Lebanon counties and in the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania. Mr. Darby was president of the Harrisburg Park Golf Club and a member of the Colonial Club. For many years he was promoter of golf in this section and it was through his efforts that the sport reached its present height of interest in Harrisburg and vicinity. He was a member of Harrisburg Lodge No. 629, F. and A. M. of this city. He was born at Parkersburg. Besides his widow, Mrs. Bertha Darby, he is survived by two daughters, Miss Rachel and Miss Katherine, of Steelton, and two brothers, George W. and L. Wayne Darby, of this city.

Teachers Tender Help to Drafted Men

State draft headquarters to-day announced that between 50,000 and 60,000 schoolteachers in Pennsylvania had pledged their aid through county, city or borough school superintendents to help drafted men make out their census cards, which will show the occupation of the men and are regarded now as the most important feature of the draft work.
