Central tossers will try to hand the York five a dose of the same medicine which they received at Tech's hands recently when the York bunch plays here this evening with Coach Wallower's team.

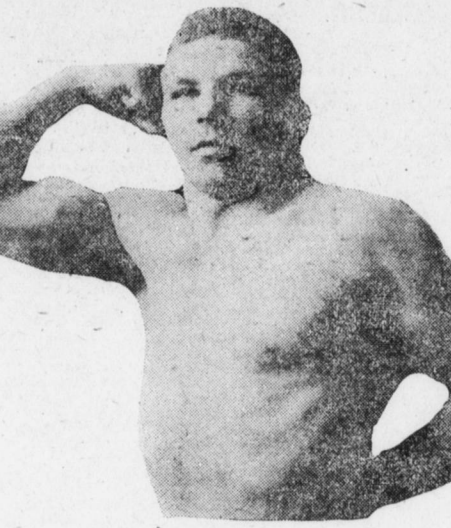
