thence northwardly along the line of said last mentioned party wall to a point which thence northwardly by a line parallel with said Emerald street and thence westwardly along the southern line of Emerald street to the center of said party wall, thence southwardly along the eastern line of said second street twenty-two feet to a point which thence eastwardly by a line parallel with said Emerald street and through the center of the brick party wall between this and adjoining house and beyond ninety-four (94) feet to a point at the corner of said second and Emerald streets; thence northwardly along the line of said last mentioned party wall to a point which thence northwardly by a line parallel with said Emerald street and thence westwardly along the southern line of Emerald street to the center of said party wall, thence southwardly along the eastern line of said second street twenty-two feet to a point which thence eastwardly by a line parallel with said Emerald street and through the center of the brick party wall between this and adjoining house and beyond ninety-four (94) feet to a point at the corner of said second and Emerald streets;
