

SHIP STRIKERS CUT LIFELINE, HURLEY WARNS

Action Invites World Disaster, He Says in Appeal to Patriotism

Baltimore, Feb. 15.—The strike of 700 carpenters for higher wages which began yesterday at the shipbuilding plant of the Bethlehem Steel Company at Sparrows Point, the Baltimore Drydock and Shipbuilding Company, and several smaller local yards, continued this morning.

Washington, Feb. 15.—Following strikes yesterday by ship carpenters and joiners in yards near New York and Baltimore, E. N. Hurley, chairman of the United States Shipping Board, is mourning the loss of the language addressed to organized labor by any government official in many years.
