

RILLING RAPS HIS COLLEAGUES

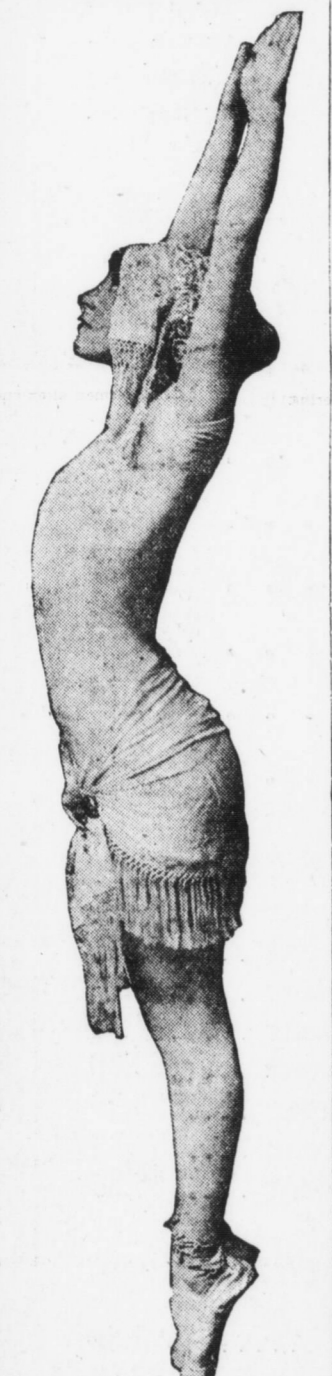
Takes Decided Exception to Rulings Made in Philadelphia Electric Rates

Public Service Commissioner John S. Rilling in an opinion dissenting from the action of a majority of the Public Service Commission in granting the Philadelphia Electric Company authority to increase its rates ten per cent, announced recently, says "We do not know of any right or authority either in the applicants to ask for or the Commission to grant any such emergency increase as a 'war surcharge'."

Mr. Rilling analyzes the statement of the business of the company and remarking that the increase also applies to two subsidiary companies says there is nothing before the Commission representing their value and he also objects to the application of the proposed increase.
