MASS MEETING FOR SHOPMEN

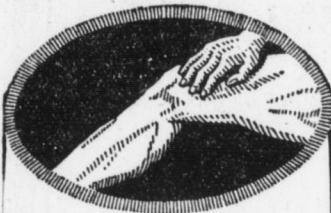
Organizers Will Outline Plans For Local Organizations Tomorrow Night

Organizers who have been active at Altoona, Bellewood, Chambersburg and other points on the Pennsylvania system will visit Harrisburg tomorrow night in the interest of local shopmen.

Since the United States government has assumed control of the railroads, it has been shown that shopmen are the only body of men not thoroughly organized, and it is said, that in order that their claims may be properly presented and taken care of in the distribution of increased wages, shop forces will be organized all over the United States.

Prominent speakers will be present tomorrow night and outline the plans for a local Brotherhood of Railroad Shopmen.

The meeting to-morrow night will be the first of a series of meetings in a campaign to organize shopmen some time ago, and for the purpose of enlightening the shopmen as to the advantages of an organization to take care of their interests.
