



Fifty Feet of Earth

Hazleton, Pa., March 12.—Albert Keller, engineer, and Daniel Frendy, fireman of a steamshovel at the Honey Brook strippings of the Le-high and Wilkes-Barre Coal Com-pany, were engulfed under fifty feet of earth in a cave-in early yes-terday morning, but rescued alive and were only slightly injured short-ly before noon, after having been given up for dead. They and four-teen others were cutting a trench for a new water flume around an exten-sive cave-in which had occurred Saturday.
