Writes From Peking, China, of Visiting Interned Austrians in Camp

Donald W. Carruthers, son of Mr. and Mrs. James B. Carruthers, this city, writes from Peking, China, where he is engaged in the work of the Army Y. M. C. A. for Legation Guards, called "the Princeton Work in Peking," as follows:

To-day is the day when the household god in the Chinese household goes up to Heaven to report on the handling of the past year and the taken place in the home. The Chinese think that if they put sugar over his mouth and place a piece of candy therein that he will be unable to open his mouth and thus they will be spared having their family misdeeds brought to light.

On Friday I rode outside the city on my examining trip about ten miles to the camp of the interned Austrian guard of 150 men. The work of the Army Y. M. C. A. is still in its infancy here.
