

STEELTON RESIDENTS MUST SEPARATE REFUSE

New Ordinance Regulating Collections in Effect After Monday

On and after April 1 all residents of the borough wishing their garbage and ashes removed by the borough must separate the refuse before collected.

This is the sum and substance of an order issued by the highway department of council this morning. The new system of collections will go into effect on Monday and the ordinance regulating the collections will be rigidly enforced.

The highway department has been granted permission by the local steel company to dump refuse on the cinder dump situated on the company's property at Locust Grove. In order to retain this location as a dumping ground the borough is compelled to dump only garbage there. The ashes will be removed by the borough and placed in different sections of the town. Ashes will also be used for filling purposes on borough property.
