

Schiffer Failure Heightens Breaking Cotton Market

New York, April 16.—Upon the opening of the New York Cotton market to-day at another severe decline in prices, the failure of Gay L. Schiffer, one of the best-known floor brokers in the Exchange, was announced. It was said his liabilities were not large. Schiffer became a member of the Exchange in 1893.

Initial prices to-day broke of from 45 to 110 points. May contracts opened at 28.50; July at 27.75 and October at 26.30.

The initial break was equivalent to \$5 a bale, or about \$30 a bale below the highest of the season. Although the market continued extremely nervous, a quick recovery followed, October selling up to 25.90.
