The special aim will be to point out that the fundamental purpose of the war is a permanent peace based upon justice and right relations between nations.

Why We're in the War 'The United States is in this war for no selfish motive whatever,' said Bishop McDowell at the Chamber of Commerce, this morning. 'It has nothing to gain for itself, even with the victory of the allied nations, excepting the future of the world, the future of humanity and for the future of all nations more than for its own security. It is not interested in expansion nor gains of any sort that cannot be secured by peaceable methods. It wants simply to be left alone to live its own life; and wants that future security to be free to do the same thing.'

The meeting this afternoon is being attended by delegates named from all the city churches. Announcement of to-night's meeting was made in all the city churches yesterday, and the Rev. Dr. Robert Bagnell, pastor of Grace Methodist Church, who is chairman of the committee in charge, said to-day that it will be necessary to hold an overflow meeting in Salem Church, adjoining the auditorium in Chestnut street.
