DAUPHIN CASES GIVEN HEARINGS

Referee Cummings Sits in Claims Made From This Section of the State

Chester W. Cummings, workmen's compensation referee of the Harrisburg district, is hearing to-day at the Masonic Temple building, two death claims for compensation, one claim for compensation for disability and a petition for modification of a compensation agreement.

Jonathan R. Matter, of 920 South Twenty-first street, has filed a claim against E. C. Snyder, lumber dealer, Eighteenth and Holly streets, for compensation for the death of their son, Ralph J. Matter. The accident occurred February 7, 1916, when it is alleged the hip of the employee was dislocated by accident and that death occurred March 26, 1918, from tuberculosis of the bone, resulting from the accident.

The claim of Mary J. Stretch, of Mechanicsburg, is filed against Hofer and Garman, 230 South Eighteenth street, for compensation for the death of her husband, Joseph B. Stretch, February 18, 1918. The petition alleges that the accident occurred August 29, 1917, when Stretch fell, while removing grease from flour rolls, fracturing the femur on the left side and remaining ill until the time of his death.

C. M. Copenhaver, 736 North Sixth street, has filed claim against the Austin Company, of Philadelphia, for broken bone in instep and ankle sustained January 13, 1918, while employed on construction work at the plant of the Harrisburg Pipe and Pipe Bending Works. Copenhaver claims he was unable to work from January 13, to February 5, and that he has not fully recovered.

H. O. Byers has filed a petition against the Romberger Hosiery Mills for modification of an existing compensation agreement. Byers sustained injury May 5, 1917, which he claims are permanent.

LAST SON OF REVOLUTION DIES Omaha, Neb., May 9.—Nelson Moore, 81 years old, believed here to have been the last actual son of the American Revolution, is dead. His father at the age of 15 fought in the Continental Army and was a member of Washington's army at Valley Forge. Mr. Moore was born at York, non, Oneida county, N. Y.
