# NATION'S CROPS **DOING WELL**


Weather Favorable for the Development of Winter Wheat; Kansas Smiles

Washington, May 16.-Following is the weather bureau's bulletin on crop conditions throughout the Unit-

ed States during the past week: The weather continues generally favorable for the development of favorable for the development of winter wheat, and the crop is making excellent progress in all of the principal producing areas. The week was exceptionally favorable in Kansas, there being plenty of sunshine and sufficient moisture for rapid development. Wheat is jointing generally in that state and heading in the southeastern portion; it is also heading nicely in Oklahoma. The crop continues in excellent condition in Missouri, and is improving in Arkansas. East of the Mississippi, wheat continues good to excellent.

The seeding of oats was well advanced or completed at the close of the week in all of the northern border states and also in the higher elevations of the Rocky Mountain districts. The warm weather of the past week in the more northern sections east of the Rocky Mountains was very beneficial for germination and vigorous growth of the plants already up.
