High School Graduates Take Part in Original and Novel Affair

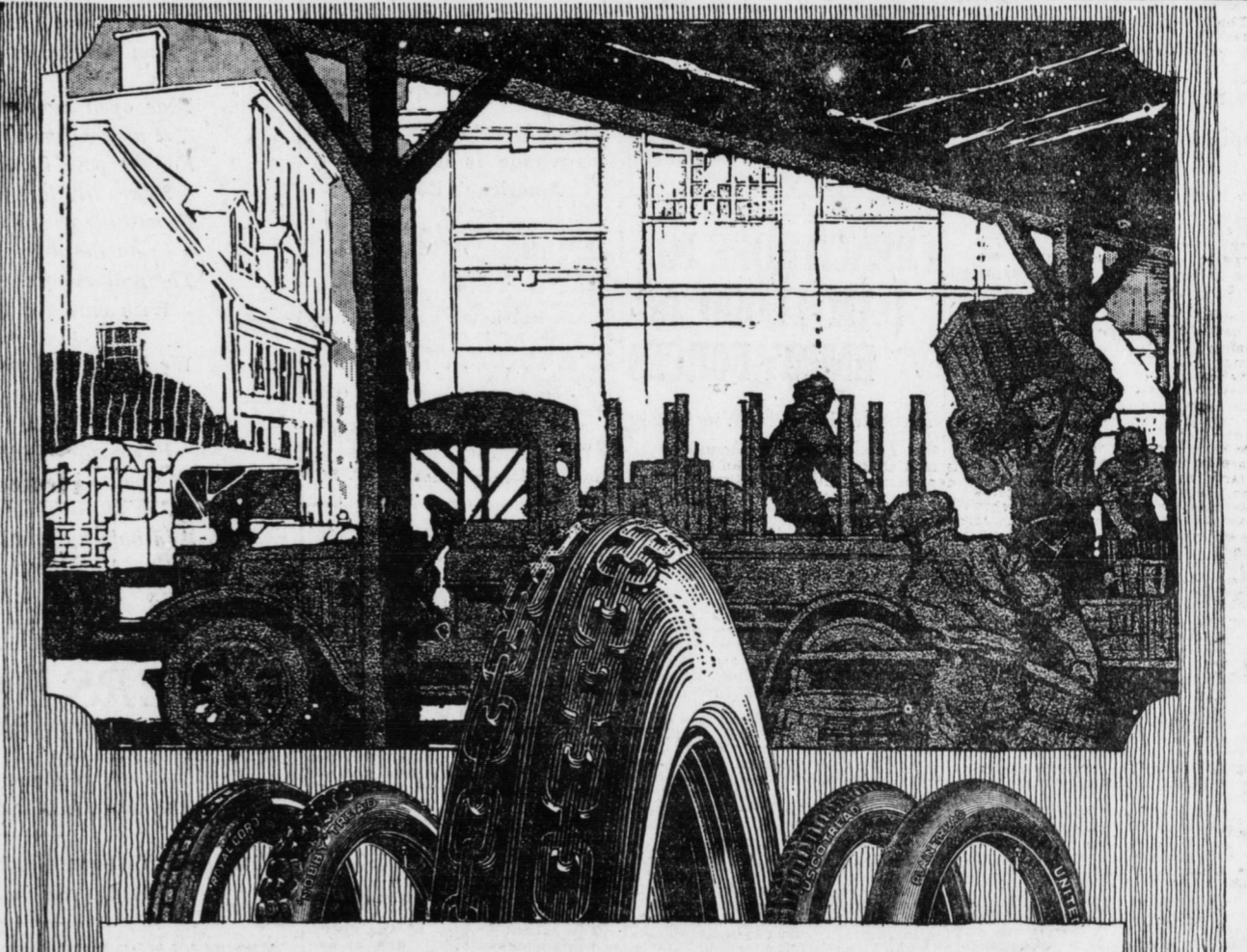
Enola, Pa., May 30.—Last evening Class Night was celebrated by members of the graduating class of the Enola High School. The program presented was a novel affair and was entirely original.
