Children to Give Unique Little Playlet



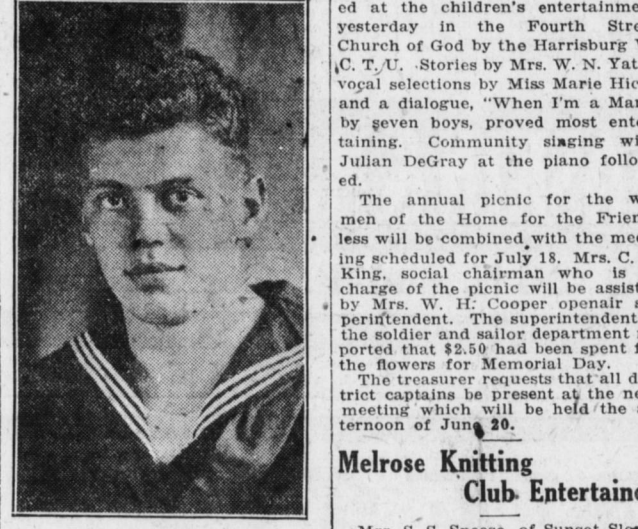
