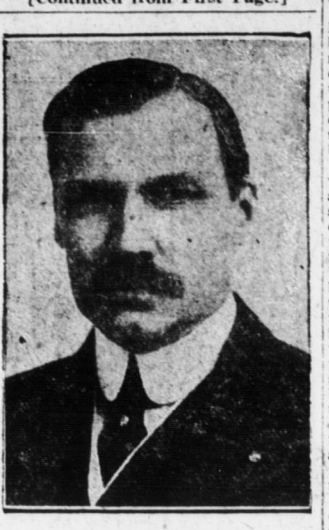


WILSON WOULD HAVE STATES SAY 'WORK OR FIGHT'

PRESIDENT MAY SMASH HEAVY NIGHT ATTACK

Washington, June 14.—President Wilson is making an indirect effort to again save the brewing interests from a prohibitive statute. He has not declared himself against the amendment to the agricultural bill, proposed by Senator Jones, of Washington, and approved by the prohibition forces of both houses, which would prohibit both the manufacture and sale of all intoxicants during the remainder of the war but he has let it be known that he does not like it.

Germans Make Violent Effort Between Bouresches and Belleau Wood

Washington, June 14.—Complete repulse of heavy enemy attacks northwest of Chateau Thierry, with heavy losses for the Germans, was reported last night in General Pershing's communique. The American lines advanced by taking the last of the German positions in Belleau Wood, remained intact.
