LAST SERMON BY DR. BAGNELL SERVICE IN RIVER PARK

Pastor of Grace M. E. Will Leave For France During the Week

Grace Methodist Church has granted leave of absence to its pastor, the Rev. Dr. Robert Bagnell, to go to Europe on a special mission covering a period of three months. Dr. Bagnell goes with the endorsement of the State Committee of Public Safety and other patriotic organizations of the state and is going as a representative of the Bureau of Public Information in Washington, and his passports are made in that way.

The sailing has all been arranged by the Y. M. C. A. authorities and he will go whenever they say they are ready for him.

Dr. Bagnell will be given a hearty sendoff Sunday evening at the close of the service by the congregation. The Sunday evening service at 7.30 o'clock will be outstandingly patriotic. Dr. Bagnell will preach on the theme: "The Critical Period of the War," a study of present conditions and the outlook in Europe.
