\$2,915,019,447 BUDGET PASSED BY THE HOUSE

Wilson's Fund \$50,000,000, Creel's \$1,250,000, No Dissent

Washington, June 18.—The sundry civil bill carrying the enormous total of \$2,915,019,447, the largest amount ever voted by Congress for the purpose, was passed by the House yesterday without a dissenting vote. It makes appropriations for the civil departments of the government, including a number which have been created since the war.

Included in the measure at the special request of the President is an appropriation of \$50,000,000 for the President's emergency fund and \$1,250,000 for the committee on public information. The President sent a letter to Chairman Shroyer, of the appropriations committee, urging the House to allow these two items.
